Michel Odent: surgeon and obstetrical physician, published scientist, considered a pioneer in his field, has been studying and observing the physiology of birth for decades, as well as the difference between the human brain and that of other mammals. His numerous studies in this latter field have led to innovative theses. In London he has created "The Primal Health Research Centre", with a data bank which is freely accessible to the public, and which collects all of the scientific (random and controlled) and epidemiological studies that have been published in various specialized journals. These studies analyze the effects of the primal period of life (pregnancy, birth, breastfeeding, the first year of life) on the psycho-physical health of the individual during adulthood. In 2010 he directed The First International Congress on Birth and Primal Health, under the aegis of WHO, a veritable milestone for medical research, and the Second International Congress on Birth and Primal health in Honolulu in 2012. He is the author of 12 books translated into 21 languages, and has published numerous articles in prestigious scientific journals.

Clara Scropetta: a university degree in Chemistry and Pharmaceutical Technology, she is also mother to 3 children and for the past ten years has been an activist in the field of maternity rights, where she has put to fruitful use her own experience and her studies as a self-taught birth guardian. She has organized seminars on birth, with Michel Odent, over the past several years. In addition to offering her services as a doula to mothers and couples during pregnancy and during and after birth, she is also author (of various articles and of the book Accanto alla madre), translator, interpreter and tutor at meetings on the topics of birth and health.

James Akre: holds academic degrees in sociology and public and international affairs with an interdisciplinary emphasis on economic and social development. His career (1973-2004) in three United Nations agencies included 25 years at the World Health Organization working in the field of international public health nutrition. During his tenure, he participated in the drafting, adoption and implementation of the International Code of Marketing of Breast-milk Substitutes; the joint WHO/UNICEF statement on breastfeeding and the role of maternity services, which is the foundation of the Baby-friendly Hospital Initiative; and the Global Strategy for Infant and Young Child Feeding. Today he focuses on the sociocultural dimension of the universal biological norm for feeding children, and on pathways for making breastfeeding once more ordinary everywhere. He is a member of the editorial board of the International Breastfeeding Review and of the Scientific Committee of La Leche League France, and a past member of the board of directors of the International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners (IBLCE).
